

What hazard have youidentified? What are the risks from it?	Who is at risk?	How are the risks already controlled? What extra controls are needed?	What has changed that needs to be thought about and controlled?
A hazard is something that may cause harm or damage. The risk is the harm that may occur from the hazard.	For example: young people, adult volunteers, visitors	<b>Controls</b> are ways of making the activity safer by removing or reducing the risk. For example, you may use a different piece of equipment or you might change the way you do the activity.	Keep <b>checking</b> throughout the activity in case you need to change what you're doing or even <b>stop</b> the activity. This is a great place to add comments which will be used as part of the review.
For example: Hazard: fire Risk: smoke inhalation or burns	Scouts, Young Leaders, Leaders and Visitors	Smoke: use dry wood, check wind direction, stand people out of smoke direction. Burns: stay a safe distance from fire, place wood on carefully, teach Scouts good practice around fires, have a burns first aid kit easily available.	
Pedestrian collision Serious major injury	All	5 mph speed limit signs. Area illuminated with floodlighting when dark. During busy times, staff in high visibility clothing to direct traffic and pedestrians.	
Vehicle collision Major injury and vehicle damage	All	5 mph speed limit. One way system in place. Ca park illuminated when dark and bays marked out. Vehicle registration system in place for busy periods.	
Uneven surface Slips & trips for pedestrians Damage to vehicles	All	Inspect and fill potholes. Clearly mark holes for pedestrians to see.	
Branches and leaves Slips and trips for pedestrians. Damage to vehicles	Crew	Trees in car park to be inspected for damage and age/condition and if necessary, employ arborist. Clear entrance and paths to site to remove leaves and twigs.
